Notes for Net Control Stations:

Net Manager: WES WILSON, KØHBZ wlw@prodigy.net; (719) 687-8758

At, or around 7:20 pm, the repeater will announce "The Tuesday Night Net will start in 10 minutes." Likewise, at 7:25 pm "The Tuesday Night Net will start in 5 minutes." Take note of at exactly what time the announcement comes on in relation to your clock. Wait until the repeater announces "The Tuesday Night Net starts immediately" before actually calling the net. Once in a very great while, somebody will forget to turn on the announcement. If you don't hear the 10 and 5 minute warnings, start the net precisely at 7:30 pm.

Net Control Identification: Part 97, FCC Rules & Regulations state that stations identify at least once every 10 minutes. It is very easy, as Net Control, to forget to do this. I watch my clock and identify on the even 10 minutes: Net starts at 7:30, identify at 7:40, 7:50, 8:00, 8:10, etc. "This is [CALLSIGN], Net Control for the Tuesday Night Net."

Be sure to leave about 3 seconds between exchanges to allow time for stations to break with comments, questions, or for emergency traffic. Avoid the urge to "quick key" your responses.

Most importantly, keep in mind that as Net Control you are the one in charge. Our net is generally very laid back and relaxed, so enjoy yourself, have fun and let your personality show through.

Net Reports: Please send the following information to the Net Manager as soon as possible after the Net in the following format: TNN Report, [DATE: MM/DD/YY], [CALLSIGN] NCS, [#] check-ins (including yourself), [#] minutes (duration of the net). It is no longer necessary to itemize the individual stations that checked in, unless you want to do so. Net reports can be delivered by Packet (KØHBZ-1), E-mail, NTS RadioGram, phone or radio. Here is a sample net report from my net on 10/17/00:
